








Demarcating the Priorities for NCI



Opportunities and Challenges

Building on Resource Books and GESI integration/ Training Workshop

Opportunities	Challenges
 Translating Resources into Nepali Enhances accessibility for a broader audience, including local government officials, community-based organizations, and grassroots stakeholders. Promotes better understanding and engagement in climate-related discussions. 	
 Extending Training Workshops to other Sub-National Bodies Strengthens decentralized climate governance by equipping provincial and local authorities with climate finance and GESI. Enhances capacity for mainstreaming climate action and gender-responsive policies at the provincial and local levels. 	 Tailored approach will be necessary. Resource constraint for scaling up training programs. Ensure sustainability of engagement and institutionalization of leaned concepts.
 Supporting Sub-National Institutions in Developing Climate Finance Enables local governments to access climate finance, leading to direct accessibility of fund at the grassroot level. Localized, community driven climate solution that align with national and international priorities. Strengthens project development skills of local bodies. 	 Limited technical expertise at the local level. Ensuring sustainability of project development efforts are beyond the scope of the initial training and support.

Opportunities and Challenges

Extend the Climate Rationale Resource Book Series into Other areas of Climate Finance:

- (a) Cost Benefit Analysis (CBA) of the Climate Finance Project
 - Assess the economic viability of climate finance projects
 - Supports prioritizations of investments
 - Strengthens the justification for funding proposals
- (b) Loss and Damage.
 - Addresses gaps in financing mechanisms to compensate for climate-induced economic and noneconomic losses.
 - Supports policy discussions on integrating L&D into national climate strategies.
 - Strengthens Nepal's position in accessing global funds dedicated to L&D.

(c) National Sources of Climate Finance & Tracking the Climate Expenditures.

- Enhances transparency and accountability in climate finance allocation and utilization.
- Strengthens Nepal's ability to mobilize domestic resources for climate action.
- Support better coordination between government agencies, private sector, and development partners.






Extend the Partnerships
